Overnight Parking Prohibited

November 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024
Between the hours of 12:00am to 7:00am.

Where

Any street and City owned parking lot within the boundaries of the City of Temiskaming Shores.

Why

By-law 2012-101, to regulate traffic and parking | Section 5.9 of schedule "A" | No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on any street or City owned parking lot between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. during the period between November 1st in one year to March 31st of the next year.

By-law 2012-019, to prohibit and regulate unusual noise | Section 4.7, exemptions, snow removal | None of the provisions of this by-law shall apply to any vehicle of the Corporation or their agents working on behalf of the Corporation to perform snow removal, snow plowing or snow clearing on any Municipal Highways and properties or to private contactors or person.

City of Temiskaming Shores Winter Operations Plan—2023-2024

Although winter weather is often random and unpredictable, city snow removal efforts are not. The city is committed to providing a high level of snow removal service throughout the winter season, with consideration to safety, environmental and budget concerns. Your cooperation in helping to keep streets clean and safe is appreciated.

Weather Monitoring Season

From October 1 to April 30, the minimum standard is to monitor the weather, both current and forecast to occur in the next 24 hours, once every shift or three times per calendar day, whichever is more frequent, at intervals determined by the municipality.

Winter Maintenance Season

The City will perform winter highway maintenance commencing on or about November 1, 2023 and is completed on or about April 15, 2024.

Roadway Service Standards

Road surfaces will be maintained by keeping them as bare as possible. Priority Road Routes plowing will begin once 5cm of snow has accumulated. Secondary Road Routes plowing will begin once 8cm of snow has accumulated.

Roadway Snow Accumulation

The objective is to maintain a minimum standard for addressing snow accumulation. Plowing begins with respect to each class of roadway in accordance with its classification and level of service standard. The depth of snow may be determined by performing an actual measurement, monitoring the weather and performing a visual estimate.

Roadway Ice Formation

The objective is to treat icy roadways with prevention methods. This is initiated when the first effects of a storm are felt in order to provide traction for traffic until the dept of snow has been reached to trigger plowing operations.

Sidewalk Service Standards

Sidewalks will be maintained in a snow packed condition. Priority Sidewalk Routes maintenance will begin once 5cm of snow has accumulated. Secondary Sidewalk Routes maintenance will begin once 8cm of snow has accumulated.

Sidewalk Snow Accumulation

The objective is to make the sidewalk as safe as possible, to be reached as soon as possible, after a storm has ended. To reduce snow to a dept less than or equal to 8 cm within 48 hours and to provide a minimum sidewalk width of 1 meter.

Sidewalk Ice Formation

The objective is to treat the icy sidewalk as soon as practicable after becoming aware that the sidewalk is icy, and in accordance with the standard. If ice forms on a sidewalk it shall be deemed in state of repair until 48 hours after it has been treated. All sidewalks that are not maintained by the municipality are considered closed for the season.

Tips

- ◆ Please **remove all objects**, including basketball nets from the roadways and sidewalks. Winter is here to stay and the plows are out. Objects obstruct snow removal and could be damaged if left on the roadway or sidewalk.
- ◆ Please **remove vehicles** from municipal areas by 11:00pm as Winter Crews begin snow removal.

Snow Removal and Disposal

As a result of snow plowing operations, snow accumulates at the side of roads as windrows or mounds. The City starts snow removal operations when these windrows reach volumes that create nuisance or hazard to pedestrians and motorists and to maintain capacity for subsequent snowfalls.

The objective is to commence removal operations in Priority 1 locations as soon as practicable after becoming aware that the snow bank accumulation is greater than 60cm and 120cm in Priority 2 location.

Significant Weather Event Route

Due to winter storms, Temiskaming Transit may have to switch to the Significant Weather Event Route. A Winter Event is a weather condition affecting roads such as snowfall, wind blown snow, freezing rain, front, black ice, etc. to which a winter event response is required.

Animal Services Update

The City of Temiskaming Shores is moving forward with the Pilot Program for Animal Services. We request the public's patience while we work within our scope and ability until the facility is open and operational.

Recruitment efforts are underway for an Animal Services Coordinator, and we will work with individuals to resolve emergencies or immediate health and safety concerns. In the interim if you experience any of the following, please contact the appropriate agency.

- ◆ For emergencies or threat to public safety contact **911** for immediate assistance.
- ◆ For animal cruelty or neglect contact Animal Welfare Services at **1-833-926-4625**.
- ◆ For issues relating to the Dog Owner's Liability Act including where a dog has bitten or attacked a person or domestic animal; or a dog has behaved in a manner that poses a menace to the safety of persons or domestic animals, please contact the Ontario Provincial Police, **1-888-310-1122**.
- ◆ Medical professionals, veterinarians, police or anyone with information about an animal bite should report the incident to the Temiskaming Health Unit at **1-866-747-4305**.
- ◆ If you are transported to the hospital, report the bite or attack to the Ontario Provincial Police as soon as possible after treatment is complete at **1-888-310-1122**.

Notice to Pet Owners—Dog and Cat Licencing

Effective January 1, 2024

Animal Care and Control By-law 2023-122

The licensing of pets is one step to encourage responsible pet ownership by properly identifying companion animals in the City. Tags are proof of ownership so animals may be returned to their owners sooner.

Register Your Pet

Every owner of a dog or cat shall register the dog or cat with Temiskaming Shores Animal Services. You may register and purchase a pet tag or a replacement tag at the following locations:

- ◆ City Hall | 325 Farr Drive, Haileybury
- ◆ Animal Hospital | Highway 11B, New Liskeard
- ◆ K9 to 5 Doggie Daycare | Highway 11, New Liskeard
- ◆ Pet Value | Highway 65, New Liskeard
- ◆ Temiskaming Shores Public Library | 285 Whitewood Ave, New Liskeard
- ◆ Temiskaming Veterinary Services | 191 Drive Inn Theatre Road, New Liskeard

Registration Process

Every person who applies to register a dog or cat, must complete the necessary form, and provide the following:

- ◆ Owner's name, physical and mailing address, and telephone number.
- ◆ Name of the dog or cat.
- ◆ Description of the dog or cat such as sex, age, breed, colour.
- ◆ Note any identifiers such as a Microchip implanted or permanent tattoo.
- ◆ Disclose if the animal is a Service Animal.
- ◆ Disclose if the dog is a Livestock Guardian Dog, or a Herding Dog.
- ◆ Disclose if the dog or cat is spayed or neutered; and
- ◆ Pay the required registration fee.

Pet Tag Annual Renewals—Available after January 1, 2024

We encourage you to renew your pet tag through the City of Temiskaming Shores Pet License Online Portal. You must register and use your access code for this option.

Please renew as soon as possible after January 1, 2024. If your pet tag has a year identified on it (2018 and prior), you must obtain a new permanent tag for a fee of \$35.00.

Please note: Lifetime Registration will be an option soon and in accordance with the Animal Services Program.
