
DTSSAB's Role in the Housing Crisis

The DTSSAB's role is in supporting and directing funding towards community partners.

This is done primarily using the below tools and resources.



Homelessness – "The situation of an individual, family, or community without stable, safe, permanent, appropriate housing, or the immediate prospect means and ability of acquiring it." The By Name List (BNL) a real time list created through collaboration of community partners, collected and shared with client consent fostering a "no wrong door approach" for clients and increasing their access to community services, including housing.

Pavilion Women's Shelter

The Pavilion Women's Centre is a safe and confidential place which provides emergency shelter and counselling services for women and their children in Temiskaming Shores.

Hope Haven Transitional House

A six-bedroom duplex staffed and operated by The Salvation Army in Kirkland Lake to support men as they move from homelessness to living in their own apartments.

Zack's Crib

A non-gender specific safe bed facility located in Temiskaming Shores.
